Working Together To Create a Better Community

A new campaign has been launched to protect the elderly and vulnerable from crime. A few weeks ago, Sgt D. Rowbotham invited members of Parkes Street Area TRA to join an event to create a better understanding for everyone in the community.

The event took place on Thursday 23rd June. Police erected a gazebo on the green of Sion Close where Sgt D Rowbotham and Crime reduction officer Pc Angela Hodgetts as well as PCSO's from Brierley Hill Police came together to conduct a survey in Parkes Street, Fenton Street, Tobruk Walk, Sion Close, and Brockley Close.

The main Items from the crime prevention survey offered to residents were :

- Personal identification on belongings
- Fire alarm installations
- Sensor lights
- Intercoms
- Padlocks
- Window Locks
- Waterboard password awareness



Many officers conducted a door to door survey which proved very positive, it gave an insight of issues on the estate.

Referrals were made to Brierley Hill fire station to fit fire alarms at homes, and contact numbers for Dudley's telecare service were handed out as they provide vulnerable adults with access to a range of support which enable people to continue living independently in their own home.

By the end of the event, everyone was pleased with the response. It was suggested that a Fun Day may be organised in the future.

Gas safety checks

We are urging council tenants to take advantage of a free annual gas check as part of a drive to ensure people's safety.

Every year around 20 people throughout the UK die from carbon monoxide poisoning caused by gas appliances and flues which are incorrectly installed or maintained, according to the UK's leading authority, the Health & Safety Executive.

Around 20,000 Dudley Council owned properties which have gas appliances installed are visited as part of a rolling service contract, carried out by the authority's new partners, PH Jones. These free visits are made to check council owned gas central heating and fires are working safely and efficiently.

Dudley Council tenants are asked to call 01384 286086 or 0300 555 8283 to arrange an appointment, if their gas appliances have not already been serviced.

Servicing is carried out from Monday to Saturday between 8am and 8pm to ensure tenants can arrange a convenient time for appointments.
