Fraud and Scams Awareness

Representatives of Dudley Federation attended a Fraud and Scams Awareness seminar run by DMBC Community Safety Team and were told some shocking and saddening statistics:

- On average there are 2187 victims of fraud per month in the West Midlands and ages 20-29 are at most risk
- The average victim of doorstep crime is an 82 year old female living alone
- It is thought that less than 10% of this is reported. This is often because the victim doesn't know they have been scammed.

Top tip: if you have doubts about the legitimacy of a request for information, take a breath and stay calm.
