## **Interactive Radio Workshops**

As part of the 5 Estates initiative, member from migrant groups, across the Borough, attended a radio and media workshop in July. The workshop was designed to promote the use of radio and media as tools for building bridges, enhancing communication skills and promoting the active participation of migrant groups in many aspects of their integration process within the community.



The workshop took two consecutive days (Friday 29th July 2011 and Saturday 30th July 2011) facilitated by New Style Radio, in Birmingham. On day one, participant was invited to join the “Breakfast Show” where each participant had the opportunity to air his/her experience.




On day two, participants, explored the different types of media and the process

of creating news and features items and the roles of those involved.



Participants were given the opportunity to take part in interactive workshop that simulated scenarios based on real life event that communities find themselves confronted by. Scenarios were recorded and played back to the group so that individual could learn from each other and receive constructive feedback.



Tony Ibandula said “I have learned more about what to expect in the studio and beyond the studio, but most important, I feel confident to undertake research and compile information into a framework that may be presented to a diverse radio audience”.

### **Black Bags**

The PDO team are aware that some of the TRA's have been asking about black bin bag deliveries so they have found this information out for anyone who needs it.

Dudley Council operates a black sack collection service for domestic refuse, black sacks are delivered in bulk to each household on a yearly basis - 52 sacks, one per week.
