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# Neighbourhood & Community Decision Making 29th February 2012

I attended this workshop on behalf of my T.R.A. It was held at The Brambles and given by Dr. Electra Soady of Eureka! Associates.

The workshop was all about communicating with migrants and asylum seekers - How can we get them involved? How can we integrate them into our society? What barriers might there be to stop them joining the community?

Everyone was involved right from the beginning. We all introduced ourselves. There were a couple of people from minority backgrounds, and also a young man, so we were a diverse mix. We all got along fine, thanks to Dr Electra. She made sure everyone felt part of the day. Everyone had the opportunity to put forward their ideas on how we should involve minorities and young people.

Tierry Bartholere gave a presentation from a migrant's point of view. It was very interesting and , at times quite funny.

We stopped for lunch, and then split up into two groups to answer the question: What stops people from joining? Lots of different ideas were put forward by both groups, and at the end of the day we presented them to each other. Both groups came up with many of the same ideas, although we were on opposite sides of the room.

Dudley Social Media Surgeries take place monthly at different locations around the borough.

### **Area housing panels -**

#### Your chance to make a difference to housing services

If you are a secure Dudley Council tenant then we have some opportunities for you to join an area panel and influence important decisions about housing and related issues.

We are looking for people to join our area panels and represent the views of tenants in your area. Each year elections are held to appoint new members who remain a panel representative for 3 years.

This year elections will be held in June and we are asking for people to put their names forward now.

Area panel members make recommendations and comment on a wide range of issues including:

- Environmental and community safety funding this means panel members help to allocate money to make areas safe and a pleasant place to live in.
- Policy changes to improve our services we ask area panel members for their views.
- Monitoring performance we want to make sure we deliver a first class housing service. Area panels discuss and comment on our performance figures, such as customer satisfaction and performance targets.
- Panel members recommend improvements this helps to ensure we continuously improve our service.
- New initiatives whenever we want to set up a new housing initiative
  we ask area panels for their views. We take their comments on
  board as this helps us to provide a service geared to meeting
  tenants' needs.

Idea generation and improvement - tenant representatives on area panels see our service from a different perspective and often provide us with good ideas to improve or introduce new services.

New tenant panel members are helped through the process and are actively encouraged to participate in discussions - so you don't have to worry about any lack of experience or housing knowledge.

Each area panel is made up of 5 tenants and 5 councillors, usually meeting every other month to discuss housing issues. Senior officers attend the meeting and all the necessary administrative support is provided.

### **Changes to Blue Badge parking scheme**

The first of a number of reforms designed to improve the Blue Badge parking scheme have been introduced in the Dudley borough. The reforms are part of Government changes to make the application process fairer and clamp down on fraud and abuse.

A new centralised system will provide new arrangements for printing and distribution to prevent fraud and to monitor cancelled, lost and stolen badges. Officers will be able to check details of new badges issued anywhere in England.

Although the scheme will still be run by councils, badges will be issued centrally in a similar way to passports – this means that the Blue Badge can no longer be collected from local offices.

If you need to renew your Blue Badge soon:

Allow time to process your application before your current badge runs out

Phone the Blue Badge Team on 0300 555 0055 to request an application form

When you have completed your form please make an appointment with the team who will check if you are eligible, check your ID, take your photograph and take payment

Charges to process applications in Dudley are going up from £2 to £5 from 1 March 2012

Martin and Stan were met by Rose and Brian from Lovells, Martin Thomas and Nigel Lindop from building services and Rachel Potterill who is the Housing Manager for the area. They were shown round the property and both Martin and Stan said that Lovells had done a fantastic job and they would move in anytime.
