

Safety tips from the emergency services

Fire – Carbon monoxide is a colourless, odourless, tasteless, poisonous gas.

A headache is the most common symptom of carbon monoxide poisoning. Other common symptoms include dizziness and nausea (feeling sick), vomiting (being sick), tiredness and confusion, stomach pain, shortness of breath and difficulty breathing.

If you experience symptoms get fresh air immediately, open doors and windows, turn off gas appliances and leave the house. See your doctor immediately or go to hospital.

All gas appliances, including your boiler, cooker and fire, should be safety checked once a year. If your appliance has not been checked call the council on 0300 555 8283 to make an appointment.

Police – If you have gadgets for Christmas such as a phone or tablet computer, mark them with a DNA solution (Secured by Design product) or write your postcode and property number with an ultraviolet (UV) pen and register at www.immobilise.com This makes them identifiable and traceable.

Ambulance – When the colder weather arrives it's important to completely defrost the windows of your vehicle before driving and drive to the road conditions.

TV licenses

Did you know that TV licenses maintains a database of registered and unregistered addresses and uses this information to target those who don't have a license? No license could mean a heavy fine!

You need to be covered by a valid TV Licence if you watch or record TV as it's being broadcast. This includes the use of devices such as a computer, laptop, mobile phone or DVD/video recorder.

There are many ways to make a payment including Direct Debit, TV Licensing Payment Card, online, over the phone and cheque through the post.

Electricity DIY – a shocking situation!

Did you know that someone dies as a result of an electrical incident in their home every week in the UK, or that electricity causes 350,000 injuries each year or that electricity problems cause half of all house fires?

Truly shocking statistics!

DIY is a hobby enjoyed by many people across the country but often it can cause more harm that good. It is a fact that half of all serious electric shocks in UK homes are a direct result of botched DIY work (source: Electrical Safety Council).

Badly carried out DIY jobs, both big and small, can put people's lives at risk and be very expensive to put right.

During a survey carried out by the Electrical Safety Council it was found that respondents owned up to many shocking events including cutting through power leads, drilling into wiring in walls and carrying out repairs on electrical appliances which were still switched on!

To carry out electrical work you must be a qualified electrician. As a tenant, as part of our rechargeable repairs policy, you will be responsible to pay for any charges incurred through our operatives putting right any badly done DIY work.

New flag unveiled

Looking for somewhere smaller to live?

If you are a Dudley Council tenant who is interested in moving to a smaller property we may be able to offer you a support package if you are in receipt of state pension*.

We currently have a waiting list for family homes which outstrips supply. Many families with children are living in homes which are too small for their needs. Because of this we are trying to free up homes which are under occupied.

Perhaps your children have now flown the nest, or you are finding it hard to maintain your home or garden, or you simply find the stairs too hard to cope with. If you have a 2, 3 or 4 bedroom house which is just too big we may be able to move you somewhere more suitable to your needs.

This scheme can help you through the process of finding and moving to a more suitable home, helping to take the stress out of arranging the move.

By downsizing to a smaller property you may save more than £40 per week, or £2,000 a year, due to cheaper costs such as rent and energy.

Let's Swap

Let's Swap is a new mutual exchange scheme for the West Midlands, Dudley Council is part of this new mutual exchange scheme which was launched in July.

If you are a tenant with Dudley Council, and you want to move and remain in rented accommodation, then our mutual exchange scheme offers the opportunity to swap with other tenants.

Mutual exchange may also be a good option if you are on our transfer list waiting for a property to become vacant. The demand for council housing in the borough is much higher than vacant properties. Therefore, if you already have a property and want to move it may be quicker to do a mutual exchange.

Let's Swap is the first regional system in the Midlands and has been developed by the WMBUS (West Midlands Best Use of Stock) partnership. There are 26 partners in WMBUS made up from local authorities and housing associations from across the region.

Registration on the Let's Swap scheme is free for Dudley tenants.

Decorating allowance cards

Following a successful three month trial housing services has launched a new decoration allowance scheme in conjunction with B&Q.

The initiative will be open to identified tenants who have moved into a new home or where they have had major works carried out and are eligible for a decorating allowance.

Instead of vouchers or cash being issued a B&Q decorating card will be supplied pre loaded for the amount allocated by the housing officer.

The card can then be used to purchase interior paints, wood care and varnishes, wallpaper and pastes, non powered decorating utensils, sandpaper, fillers and sealants.







Controversial payday loan websites have been blocked on the Council's public access computers in libraries and other community venues. The action aims to help residents avoid being drawn into excessively high interest loans.

As an alternative for people who are looking to borrow money the Council is encouraging people to take advantage of Castle and Crystal Credit Union which offers savings accounts and a range of loans with interest rates to suit individual circumstances.

As well as the credit union's main office in Dudley, Castle and Crystal now provides a new service at Stourbridge Library which is open from 10.30am to 2.30pm each Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Living on a budget

According to research for the Payments Council millions of benefits claimants in the UK will struggle to manage their money under Universal Credit. When Universal Credit is introduced most people will receive their benefits once a month and the Payments Council said that 2.7 million current claimants will struggle with their finances as a result.

The Council's adult and community learning team has joined up with housing services to offer tenants the Live4Less programme which provides tips and practical advice on how to manage money and make budget savings. The programme is supported by the local Citizens Advice Bureau.

The course covers budgeting, setting priorities, reducing transport costs and improving energy efficiency, including how to find the best deal from energy companies. It also covers other topics such as food and healthy eating on a budget.

The course lasts for 6 weeks with a 2 hour session every week and to date over a hundred people have taken part.

Feedback shows that people have saved money in a variety of ways including utilities, TV broadband packages, food bills and home insurance. Some people who took part have also commented on a change to their health and well-being by following tips on healthy eating and cooking.
