Fence boundaries

If you were at the last DFTRA general meeting you may have heard a brief discussion regarding fence boundaries and changes. We sought clarification and here is the situation:

There is no law about who owns the boundaries around your property, e.g. which side of the fence, walls or hedges you're responsible for. You will need to check your deeds to find out if there are any boundary agreements. If nothing has been agreed you can set up an agreement with your neighbours. Basically – it all depends upon the deeds to the property.

In relation to council properties: fences are now the responsibility of the tenant, with the only exceptions being privacy panels onto open land or a right of way or fences to avoid falls from height.
